



Small Pumpkin

Pattern Instructions



Small pumpkin:

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring [6]

Rnd 2: (inc) repeat 6 times [12]

Rnd 3: (sc BLO in next st, inc) repeat 6 times [18]

Rnd 4: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next st, inc) repeat 6 times [24]

Rnd 5: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next 2 st, inc) repeat 6 times [30]

Rnd 6: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next 3 st, inc) repeat 6 times [36]

Rnd 7: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next 4 st, inc) repeat 6 times [42]

Rnd 8: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next 5 st, inc) repeat 6 times [48]
Rnd 9-16: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next 7 st) repeat 6 times [48]
Rnd 17: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next 5 st, dec) repeat 6 times [42]
Rnd 18: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next 4 st, dec) repeat 6 times [36]
Rnd 19: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next 3 st, dec) repeat 6 times [30]
Rnd 20: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next 2 st, dec) repeat 6 times [24]
Rnd 21: (sc BLO in next st, sc in next st, dec) repeat 6 times [18]

Stuff with fiberfill.

Rnd 22: (sc BLO in next st, dec) repeat 6 times [12]
Rnd 23: (dec) repeat 6 times [6]

Fasten off leaving a long tail. Weave in the yarn tail in front loops of the rest 6 stitches with large sewing needle, then pull to close the hole. Don't cut off the yarn.

Now your amigurumi pumpkin is divided into 6 sections by lines made of front loops you left 6 times in each round. Insert the needle with yarn tail through all the loops of 1st line moving from the top to the bottom of your pumpkin. Give a gentle tug to make a slight indent. Insert the needle through the center of the pumpkin to the other side and pull the yarn tightly. Repeat the steps 5 more times to create evenly spaced indents around the pumpkin. Tie off yarn and secure.

Stem:

Rnd 1: 6 sc in magic ring [6]
Rnd 2: sc in all 6 st in back loops only [6]
Rnd 3: sc in all 6 st [6]
Rnd 4: (sc in next 2 st, inc) repeat 2 times [8]
Rnd 5: (sc in next 3 st, inc) repeat 2 times [10]

Finish with sl st. Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.
Sew the stem in place on top of the pumpkin.
