## Material

### Yarn:

Rios, Malabrigo Yarn, 0.0 yards

### Needles:

circular: US7 /4.5mm

circular: US9 /5.5mm

## Technics

### Cable Pattern

Round 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl Round 2: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl Round 3: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl  
Round 4: K1tbl, P1, K3, C6F twice, P1, K1tbl Round 5: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl Round 6: K1tbl, P1, K15,  
P1, K1tbl Round 7: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl Round 8: K1tbl, P1, C6B twice, K3, P1, K1tbl Repeat these 8  
rows for the pattern.

## Glossary

### BOR

Beginning of round

### M1L

Make 1 Left - insert left needle from front to back into the ladder between stitches and knit.

### M1R

Make 1 Right - insert left needle from back to front into the ladder between stitches and knit.

### K1tbl

Knit 1 stitch through the back loop.

### C6B

Cable 6 stitches backward. Place 3 stitches on cable needle and hold in the back of your work. Knit next 3 stitches. Knit the 3 stitches off of the cables needle.

### C6F

Cable 6 stitches forward. Place 3 stitches on cable needle and hold in front of your work. Knit next 3 stitches. Knit the 3 stitches off of cable needle.

### P2tog

Purl 2 stitches together.

### K2tog

Knit 2 stitches together.

### SM

Slip Marker

### PM

Place Marker

## Gauge

10\*10cm (4\*4") = 28 stitches \* 20 rows in Stockinette stitches

## Left Hand

Using the smaller circular or double pointed needles, cast on 35 stitches with the long tail cast on. Join for knitting in the round by passing the last cast on stitch on the right hand needle over the first stitch on the left hand needle. You will now have 34 stitches.

If you do not want to start this way then cast on 34 stitches and join for knitting in the round.

Place a stitch marker to mark the BOR.

Work 1x1 (K1,P1) rib for approximately 3" – you are welcome to increase or decrease the length of your cuff as you like.

Switch to the larger needles.

This step is written out for working magic loop. It can also be worked on dpns, however, given the extensive cable pattern on the front this will be somewhat difficult.

### Row 1

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1

Needle 2: K16

### Row 2

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, M1L (19st)

Needle 2: K1, M1L, K7, M1l, K8, M1L (19sts)

**Row 3**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: knit to end

\*\*\* THUMB GUSSET \*\*\*

Number in brackets indicates the amount of stitches created for thumb gusset.

The pattern is worked across the front needle and the thumb gusset is worked on the back needle.

Set up :

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K3, C6F twice, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to one stitch from end, pm, M1R, K1, M1L. (3)

**From row 1 to 2:**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, knit to end.

**Row 3**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, M1R, knit to end M1L. (5)

**Row 4**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, C6B twice, K3 P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, knit to end.

**Row 5**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, knit to end.

**Row 6**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, M1R, knit to end M1L. (7)

**Row 7**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, knit to end.

**Row 8**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K3, C6F twice, P1, K1tbl Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, knit to end.

**Row 9**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl, knit to end. (9)

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, M1R, knit to end M1L. (9)

**From row 10 to 11:**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, knit to end.

**Row 12**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, C6B, K3, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, M1R, knit to end M1L. (11)

**From row 13 to 14:**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, knit to end.

**Row 15**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, M1R, knit to end, M1L. (13)

**Row 16**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K3, C6F twice, P1, K1tbl.

Needle 2: Knit to marker, remove the marker and place the next 13 stitches onto waste yarn. Cast on 1 stitch using the backwards loop method - this replaces the stitch lost to the thumb gusset.

Continue with the cable pattern until the glove measures 3.75" from the end of the thumb gusset. You will have worked about 4 cable repeats - finish one row after the cable row.

\*\*\* DECREASE \*\*\*

You will be working most of the decreases on the back needle with only two sets of decreases on the front needle. - For a tutorial on the Kitchener Stitch - <https://blog.tincanknits.com/2013/10/03/kitchener-stitch/>

**From row 1 to 2:**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: K1, SSK, Knit to 3 sts before end, K2tog, K1

**Row 3**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, follow cable pattern, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: K1, SSK, Knit to 3 sts before end, K2tog, K1

**Row 4**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, \*K1, K2tog\* repeat from \*to \*, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: K1, SSK, Knit to 3 sts before end, K2tog, K1

**Row 5**

Needle 1: SSK, K2tog to end

Needle 2: K1, SSK, Knit to 3 sts before end, K2tog, K1.

You will have 7 stitches left on your needles

Break yarn leaving a 12" tail and kitchener stitch the top of the glove closed.



### \*\*\* THUMB \*\*\*

Place the held stitches back onto the larger needles.

Knit across these stitches and pick up one stitch from the body of the mitten.

Place marker and join for working in the round.

Knit every round until the thumb measures 1.75" from where you picked up stitches.

K2tog around, break yarn leaving a 6" tail and weave ends through the stitches, cinching the top of the thumb closed.

Weave in the end.

You will have a small gap at the base of the thumb where you picked up the stitch, using the tail where you picked up the stitches, sew the hole closed.

All done!

Give your mittens a light block to flatten out the stitches.

### Right Hand

Using the smaller circular or double pointed needles, cast on 35 stitches with the long tail cast on. Join for knitting in the round by passing the last cast on stitch on the right hand needle over the first stitch on the left hand needle. You will now have 34 stitches.

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Needle 2: M1R, K1, M1L, pm, knit to end. (3)

### **From row 1 to 2:**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: Knit to marker, sm, knit to end.

### **Row 3**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, K15, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: M1R, Knit to marker, M1L, sm, knit to end. (5)

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**Row 3**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, follow cable pattern, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: K1, SSK, Knit to 3 sts before end, K2tog, K1

**Row 4**

Needle 1: K1tbl, P1, \*K1, K2tog\* repeat from \*to \*, P1, K1tbl

Needle 2: K1, SSK, Knit to 3 sts before end, K2tog, K1

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Needle 1: SSK, K2tog to end

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You will have 7 stitches left on your needles

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
