This pattern will require the following stitches: Magic ring Increase Decrease Single crochet Half double crochet Latch hook method Chaining Whip stitch Fasten off Slip stitch You will need the following: -4.5mm crochet hook - James C Brett Flutterby Chunky yarn, in colours B11 (mint), B2 (pale pink), B28 (fawn) and B47 (rich pink) -X2 pairs of 15mm safety eyes -Darning needle -Stitch markers -Stuffing -Black embroidery thread Pattern written and distributed by Cozy Cryptid Co. Pattern Instructions



Head of

Cow

With the head of the cow, feel free to add colour changes to the darker pink if you feel comfortable doing so, in order to create the darker patches in the photo

In light pink:

Row 1

6sc in mr (6)

Row 2

Inc x6 (12)

Row 3

[Sc, inc] x6 (18)

Row 4

[Sc x2, inc] x6 (24)

Row 5

[Sc x3, inc] x6 (30)

Row 6

[Sc x4, inc] x6 (36)

From row 7 to 13:

Sc around [7 rounds] (36)

Row 14

[Sc x4, dec] x6 (30)

Row 15

[Sc x3, dec] x6 (24)

Add the safety eyes between rows 12 and 13, approx 10 st apart. Stuff firmly as you go

Row 16

[Sc x2, dec] x6 (18)

Row 17

[Sc x1, dec] x6 (12)

Row 18

Dec x6 (6)

Fasten off, whip stitch the head closed



*Cow
ears*

(Make 2) in light pink:

Row 1

6sc in mr (6)

Row 2

Inc x6 (12)

Row 3

[Sc, inc] x6 (18)

Row 4

Sc around (18)

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing, attach to the sides of the head as shown, with one side of the ear pinched slightly to form the shape shown



Cow muzzle

In fawn:

Row 1

Ch-7. Sc into the 2nd ch from the hook, sc x6. When you get to the end of the row, turn, and sc into each of the chs on the other side. Mark the last stitch (12)

Row 2

Inc x12 (24)

Row 3

[Sc, inc] x12 (36)

From row 4 to 6:

Sc around [3 rows] (36)

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing. Attach to the front of the head with the top of the muzzle lining up to the bottom of the eyes. Stuff the muzzle when you are approx 2/3rds of the way around



Cow horns



(Make 2) in fawn:

Row 1

4sc in mr (4)

Row 2

[Sc, inc] x2 (6)

From row 3 to 5:

Sc around (6)

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing, attach to the top of the head



Cthulhu head



In mint:

Row 1

6sc in mr (6)

Row 2

Inc x6 (12)

Row 3

[Sc, inc] x6 (18)

Row 4

[Sc x2, inc] x6 (24)

Row 5

[Sc x3, inc] x6 (30)

Row 6

[Sc x4, inc] x6 (36)

From row 7 to 12:

Sc around [6 rows] (36)

Row 13

6sc, [ch-12, hdc in each stitch, sc into next stitch of the head] x4, 26sc (36)

Row 14

Sc x6. When you reach the tentacles, put a sc under each one, to create a stitch. This will make sure there are no holes in the head where the tentacles are, then sc in the stitches that are there [create under tentacle, sc, create, sc, create, sc, create, sc]. Finish the round with sc around (40)

Row 15

[8sc, dec] x4 (36)

Add the safety eyes between rows 12 and 13, approx 10 st apart (either side of the tentacles). Stuff firmly as you go

Row 16

[4sc, dec] x6 (30)

Row 17

[3sc, dec] x6 (24)

Row 18

[2sc, dec] x6 (18)

Row 19

[sc, dec] x6 (12)

Row 20

Dec x6 (6)

Fasten off, whip stitch the head closed



Legs and body



You will need to make 2 legs, one in mint green, one starting with dark pink then changing colour to light pink. We will start in the mint for simplicity.

In mint:

Row 1

6sc in mr (6)

Row 2

Inc x6 (12)

Row 3

[Sc, inc] x6 (18)

From row 4 to 11:

Sc around [8 rounds] (18)

Fasten off. Repeat steps 1 to 3 in dark pink, then colour change to light pink. Repeat to row 11, do not fasten off. Ch-2, then colour change to mint, ch-2 and sc into a stitch of the mint leg. This will be the new starting stitch in the round, mark this with a stitch marker. [Same as with the head of the cow, if you feel comfortable adding more colour changes to dark pink as "patches" feel free]

From row 12 to 17:

In mint, sc 20, colour change to light pink, sc 2, change to mint, sc 2 [6 rounds] (44)

Row 18

[2sc, dec] x11, maintaining the colour change method in decreases if needed (33)

From row 19 to 24:

Sc around maintaining colour changes [5 rounds] (33)

Row 25

[Sc, dec] x11, maintaining the colour change method in decreases if needed (22)

From row 26 to 30:

Sc around maintaining colour changes [5 rounds] (22)

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing. Stuff the body firmly. Attach the cthulhu head to the pink side of the body, and the cow head to the mint side. Ensure you have closed gaps at the top by sewing closed with yarn. Using black embroidery thread, add "stitches" across the body where the colour changes are



Arms

You will need to make 2 arms, one in mint green, one starting with dark pink then changing colour to light pink. We will start in the mint for simplicity.

In mint:

Row 1

6sc in mr (6)

Row 2

Inc x6 (12)

From row 3 to 10:

Sc around (12)

Fasten off, leave long tail for sewing. Stuff firmly. Repeat steps 1 and 2 in dark pink, colour change to light pink, and continue on to round 10. Fasten off. Attach the pink arm to the mint side of the body, and the mint arm to the pink side.



Cow tail



In dark pink:

Row 1

4sc in mr (4)

From row 2 to 9:

Sc around [8 rows] (4)

Fasten off, leave long tail for sewing, no need to stuff. Cut some strips of fawn coloured yarn (about 2 to 3 inches each), and attach to the end of the tail using the latch hook method. Sew to the middle of the back of the toy



Cthulhu wing



In mint:

Row 1

Ch 5, turn

Row 2

In second ch from hook, 4sc, ch 4, turn

Row 3

In second ch from hook, 7sc, ch 1, turn

Row 4

In second ch from hook, 4sc, ch 4, turn

Row 5

In second ch from hook, 7sc, ch 3, turn

Row 6

In second ch from hook, 6sc, ch 4, turn

Row 7

In second ch from hook, 9sc, don't turn

Row 8

Sc along the top of the wing all the way along until you get to where you started the wing. Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing, weave in any ends. Attach to the pink side of the back of the body



Finished!

You are finished! Make sure any ends are woven in, use a lint roller to remove any fluff and enjoy!
