

# Techniques

### **Knit stitch**

This stitch is very commonly used in the world of knitting. Insert your needle into your next st, place needle behind left hand needle, wrap yarn around and pull through st.

## **Purl stitch**

This stitch is also very commonly used in the world of knitting. Insert your needle into the next st, placing the needle in front of your left hand needle, wrap yarn around needle and pull through st.

## **Making tassels**

Cut several long pieces of yarn, pick one, fold in half, thread on to your darning needle, insert needle where the tassel is needed, there should be a loop in which you can pull through the rest of the yarn.





## What you will need:

UK 4mm knitting needles Hayfield bonus breeze DK (2 skeins) Darning needle Scissors Tape measure

For your simple sea blue scarf, Cast on 70 sts on needle. For this project there are only two techniques used, knit st and purl st. Knit st is used on the very first row, then purl st on the second, and knit st on the third row, and so on, hopefully you get what I mean! This technique is known as stockinette/stocking st.

This knit one row, purl one row repeats throughout the whole scarf. In total you need to knit 312 rows.

Cast off and make tassels on both ends of your scarf. A guide to making tassels are in the techniques section. You can also find tutorials online. Thank you so much for reading my pattern, and most importantly, making your own scarf!
