The floral motif at the center of each square brings a gentle bloom to the design, while the lace-trimmed top adds a romantic, handcrafted charm. Named "Ocean Bloom" for its blend of sea-inspired colors and blossoming flower patterns, this pouch is a nod to nature's quiet elegance. Lightweight, beginner-friendly, and effortlessly pretty — it's the perfect blend of simplicity and style for warm, sunny days.

Pattern Instructions



Intro and Granny Square



Materials:

5ply white Yarn 100 gram

5ply light blue Yarn 50 gram

5ply Dark Blue Yarn 50 gram



3.5 mm hook
 Beaded Lace 20 inch
 Matching light blue zipper
 Matching light blue cloth
 Scissors
 Darning needle
 Measuring Tape

Vocabulary:
 Single crochet: sc
 Chain: ch
 Cluster: CL
 Half double crochet: hdc
 Double crochet: Dc
 Treble Crochet: Tr
 Double Crochet 2 together: DC2TOG

Lets start with The Granny Square

Row 1

Pick your white yarn.
 make a magic ring and insert 16 Dc. Close the ring with a slip
 stitch in the first stitch.
 Ch1 and cut the yarn leaving a small loose strand.

Row 2

Pick your Light Blue yarn. Tie it in any stitch.
 Ch2.{ Insert DC2TOG (in the same stitch), Ch2, DC2TOG (in the
 next stitch), Ch1} repeat this 8 times.
 Join your work with a slip stitch in the first stitch. Ch1 and cut
 the yarn with a small loose strand.

2 (How to make double crochet 2 together)

Yarn over, insert hook in stitch and pull up a loop. You have 3
 loops on your hook, then Yarn over pull through two loops.
 This is where we leave the DC incomplete. So now we yarn over
 again, insert hook in the same stitch and pull up a loop. Yarn
 over and pull through two loops. And again yarn over Pull
 Through all the three loops. This makes your 2 DCs made
 together.

Row 3

Pick your Dark Blue yarn: Tie it on any Ch1 space.
 Sc in Ch1 space, Ch2. In the Ch2 space ahead make (CL,
 Ch1,CL), Ch2. Repeat this 8 times till the end of the row. SLip
 stitch in the sc stitch. Ch1 and cut the yarn keeping a loose
 strand.

:

It comprises 3 Dc worked together.

Yarn over, insert hook in stitch and pull up a long loop. You
 have 3 loops on your hook, then Yarn over pull through two
 loops. This is where we leave the Dc incomplete. So now we
 yarn over again, insert a hook in the same stitch and pull up a
 loop. Yarn over and pull through two loops. Again, yarn over,
 insert hook in stitch, pull up a long loop that meets the stitches
 height, yarn over pull through two loops.

Now you have 4 loops on your hook. Yarn over pull through all
 4 loops.

Row 4

Pick your white yarn. Tie it on any sc stitch.

Just to make sure, we will be working in the sc stitches of the previous row only.

Ch2,(Insert a Dc, Tr, Ch2, Tr. Dc in the sc stitch. Then Ch4, Insert a hdc in the next sc stitch. Then Ch4.) Repeat this in the next sc stitches all the way around the row for a total of 4 times. Slip stitch in the sc in the end. DO NOT CUT THE YARN.

Row 5

Slip stitch in the Ch2 space.

Ch1. Insert 2 Dc, Ch2, 2 Dc in the ch2 space. This makes the corner of each space. In the next 2 stitches, place Dc. Then in the ch4 space, insert 4 Dc and you repeat this pattern around the row. In the places of Ch4 you will insert 4Dc and in place 2 place stitches before corner, insert Dc.

In the end, you must have 16 stitches on each side, excluding the Ch2s.

Make total of 4 granny squares



Joining Granny Square



You will be joining your granny squares one by one, keeping your opposite sides facing, using a slip stitch join.

So keeping your wrong sides to each other, tie your white yarn in any ch2 space of both granny squares. Pull up a loop.

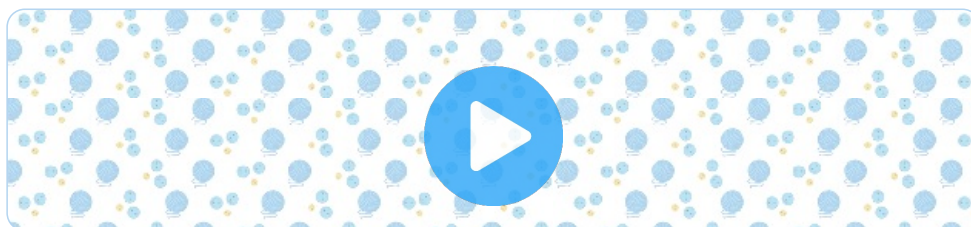
Now notice that 4 loops are visible on the weed stitch.

And we will insert hook on the front loop and the back loop.

You see as I have marked with the black spot.

You will join all your granny squares one by one with the WRONG SIDES facing together.

You will join the bottom with this slip stitch method too.



Extended Rows



Once you form a pouch shape, you must join the same yarn on your open side so that we would Ch1, and make a row of sc.

After this cut the yarn with a ch1 and attach your dark blue colored yarn.

Make 7 Rows of sc. if you want it to be larger than you can exceed 10 rows Maximum. This is the place where we will be sewing our beaded lace.

Once done, you may ch1 and cut the yarn.

You are requested to sew in all the loose strands to avoid imperfection.



Cloth and zipper



Now for sewing the cloth with a zipper on, I would suggest you to use a sewing macing to mark your size of the pouch accurately and sew it along with the zipper. Once done then you keep the cloth inside your pouch and sew it around. BUT, AVOID SEWING THE ZIPPER END. My sewing machine needle broke when I tried to sew my pouch on the edges where the zip line meets and that turned out in making me decide to hand sew the edge close myself.

It is totally fine if you sew the whole part with the machine and close the uses using your hand sewing.

Take your time and do it calmly.



Sewing the beaded lace



Once your cloth is sewed in, you are requested to keep your beaded lace around the 5th row of your pouch and fix it using sewing pins. Grab a white colored thread and sew the top of the lace only on the 5th row stitch ONLY. Make sure you don't sew it inside the stitches, making your inside cloth to be sewed together. Prevent that. Make it nice and tight.
